One Nevada Agreement

- July 2021 – the State of Nevada, City of Las Vegas, and 28 other local governments entered into the One Nevada Agreement on Allocation of Opioid Recoveries.
- One Nevada agreement authorizes the State of Nevada and outside counsel Egle Adams to negotiate settlements on behalf of all 29 local governments.

The One Nevada Agreement sets a formula for the allocation for settlement monies:

Formula for City portion of Opioid Settlements

- (1) 38.77% of total settlement goes to 29 local governments
- (2) 6.836% of the 38.77% goes to the City
- (3) Egle Adams' fees and costs then deducted

Community Recovery Funds Approved Uses

[NRS 433](#) (SB390 (2021 Session)) sets approved uses of settlement funds on projects and programs to include but not limited to:

- Expanding prevention, treatment, and recovery initiatives
- Services to reduce harm caused by substance abuse
- Capital projects related to substance abuse
- Prevention/treatment of infectious disease in people with substance abuse disorders



Community Recovery Funds

Planning Process

- The City participated in roundtable discussions with other local jurisdictions to identify regional gaps to meet the need and prevent duplication efforts
- Established Community Recovery Special Revenue Fund to provide \$3.04 M of opioid settlements received through 2023
- Funds to be used to expand on existing opioid-use and opioid-use disorder programs through 2026
- City proposed funding-use strategy that focused on 3 of the eligible use categories under NRS 433, further prioritized by Las Vegas City Council:

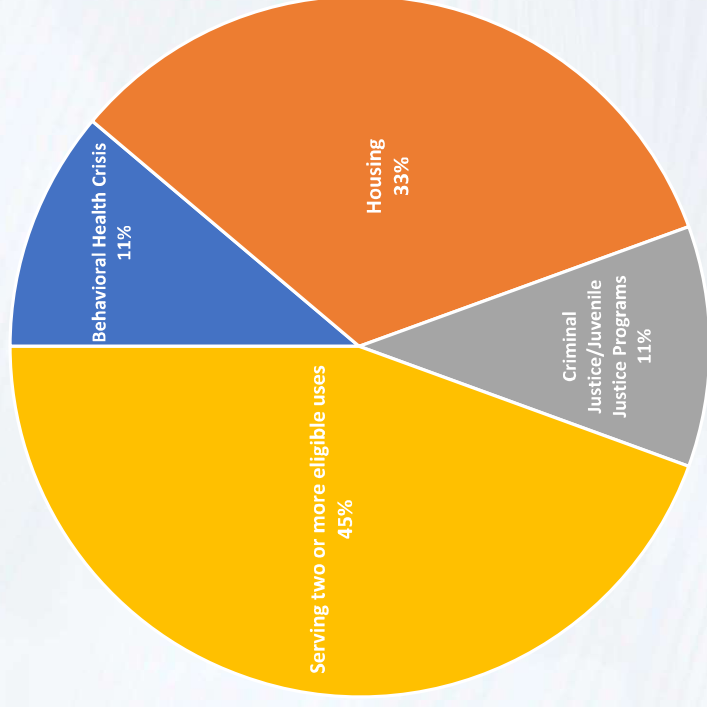
1. Provide housing for persons who have or are in recovery from substance use disorders
2. Behavioral health crisis services
3. Programs for persons involved in the criminal justice/juvenile justice system

■ Behavioral Health Crisis ■ Housing ■ Criminal Justice/Juvenile Justice Programs ■ Serving two or more eligible uses



Community Recovery Funds Reporting Requirements

- Awardees required to submit quarterly reports
- Awardees must provide necessary documentation to demonstrate how funds were expended
- Awardees must provide performance measures to gauge the effectiveness of the funded programs
- City required to submit annual fiscal reporting to State Chief Attorney General



Next Steps

1. Upon City Council approval, notify applicants of awards
2. Commence negotiations with successful applicants to identify performance metrics, reporting requirements, and enter into grant agreements
3. Begin disbursement of funds to awardees
4. Monitor performance
5. January 2025, submit required annual fiscal report to State Chief Attorney

General
