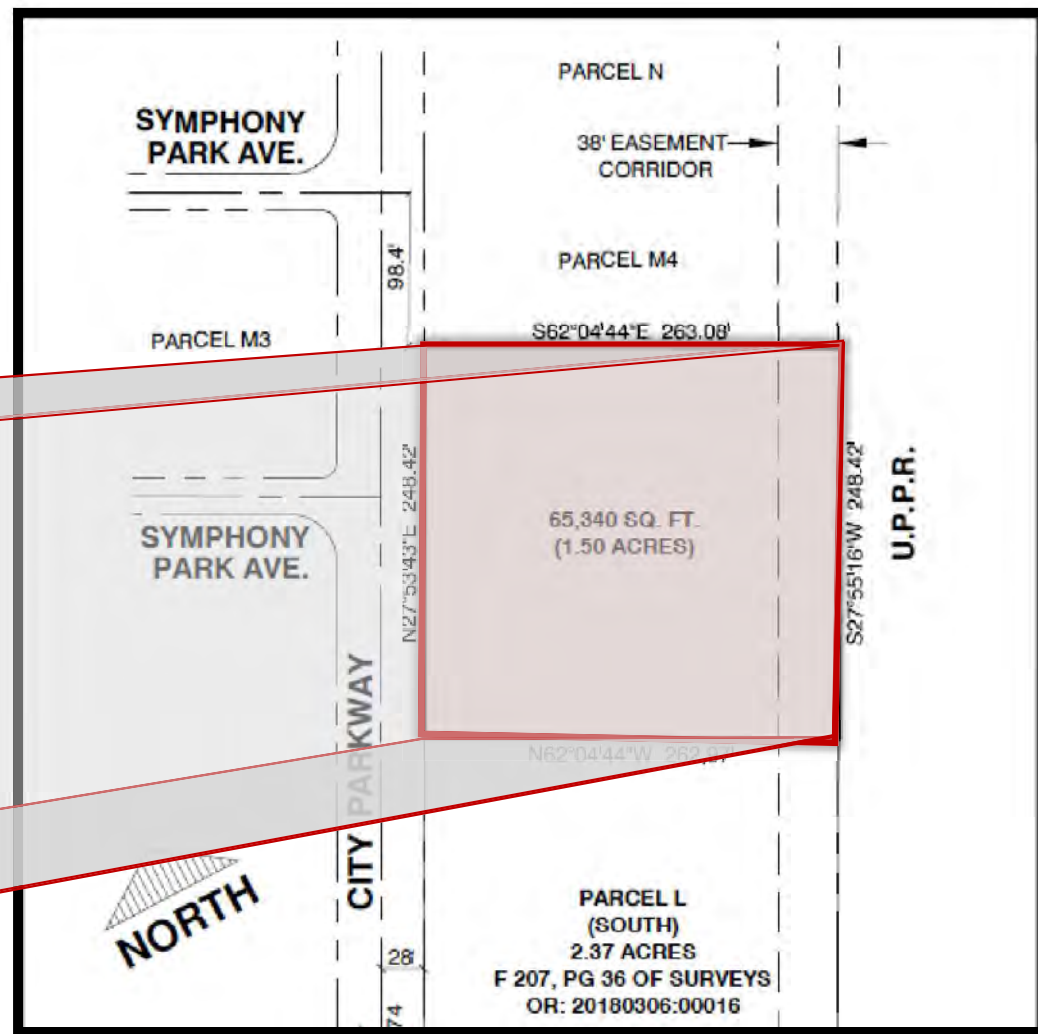

LVMA

- The Las Vegas Museum of Art (LVMA) and its founding Board of Trustees, in partnership with the Elaine P. Wynn & Family Foundation and the Los Angeles County Museum of Art (LACMA), will establish an art museum in Las Vegas.
- The LVMA aims to partner with the City of Las Vegas on land through a gift or long-term lease on Symphony Park parcel LM4, a site long considered for an art museum.
- With the support and leadership of LACMA, the largest art museum in the Western United States, the LVMA can borrow artworks, mount exhibitions, adapt educational programs and draw from LACMA's extensive professional expertise. This will allow the LVMA to operate at the highest quality with shows of global recognition from its inception.
- The LVMA has already elicited state support, with the NV Legislature awarding \$5M in seed funding in the 2023 legislative session.
- The LVMA is producing an economic impact study with Jeremy Aguero of Applied Analysis
- The LVMA has received letters of support from elected officials: Congresswoman Titus, Senator Rosen, Senator Cortez-Masto and Congresswoman Lee in addition to cultural institutions: the Nevada Ballet Theater, the Smith Center, and the Discovery Children's Museum.
- The LVMA will have consistent changing exhibitions and support educational efforts by engaging school groups, organizing field trips, developing in-school activities and offering programming for all ages.
- The LVMA is a vital catalyst to create infrastructure for the arts, generate career opportunities, drive cultural tourism, bring potential future art fair(s) and create space for artists living and working in the Southern Nevada region.
- As Las Vegas continues to evolve, a growing sense of civic pride will be strengthened and enhanced by a world class art museum.
