Facade Concepts

Responsiveness to solar conditions

Sunshades react to facade orientation to reduce cooling loads and contribute to the building's appearance and sustainability.

The Civic Thread as shading device and active circulation

The Civic Thread canopy feature winds throughout the side, provides shade below, and connects programs above while providing novelty and views to visitors which activates the space.

Respect for City Hall

Facade becomes more open as it comes closer to City Hall, to create an overall gesture of "opening up" to welcome citizens to City Hall and follow the Civic Thread in unifying the complex.



For rece:

Communication of active programs

Active programs, including spaces on the lower levels with indoor-outdoor connections, feature extra-clear low-iron glass

Privacy for secure programs

Private or secure programs feature blue glazing to match City Hall


Temporary parking in Building Two location Civic Thread constructed to full length, acting as 'gateway' structure and plaza edge
