He then accepted a position and as a City Council Liaison to former Las Vegas Councilman Gary Reese. He held that position until December 31, 1999, then was appointed to the City Council to represent the city's newly created Ward 5; and
- Whereas; Lawrence Weekly was appointed by former Governor Jim Gibbons after serving 7 years as a Councilman to serve as a Clark County Commissioner. He served 13 years in this capacity, and completed his final term on January 4, 2021; and
- Whereas Lawrence Weekly served on many boards. He was the first African-American Chair on the Las Vegas Convention and Visitor's Authority Board. He served on the Las Vegas Valley Water District; University Medical Center, Southern Nevada Workforce; and Nevada League of Cities Community & Economic Development Committee to name a few; and
- Whereas; Lawrence Weekly represented a large population of underserved residents, foster and adopted children, the LGBTQ community, Dreamers, and other underserved and marginalized groups; and
- Whereas; We honor Lawrence Weekly for his outstanding career in public office. He has a legacy of providing leadership with compassion to his community, and his long-standing efforts deserve the highest accolades; and now
